FUND RAISERS? DUES INCREASES? CONSOLIDATION WITH ANOTHER SHRINE CENTER? THE CHOICE IS YOURS.

Greetings Nobles and Ladies,

As the Chairman of The Bingo Committee I see a lot of how the finances of the Shrine Center are working. And we are reaching a point where we are, in my opinion, in trouble.

Rent for the office and meeting space, insurances, moneys to Imperial, etc., must be met or we cannot function as a Center.

There are three ways we bring in money. Dues, Fundraisers, Donations.

Current dues. These dues only bring in about half of what is needed to run the Center. Many reasons here. Declining membership from deaths and fewer men joining, Demits, Suspension, Aid to Nobles that can not pay dues due to hardship, members that qualify for waived dues for years of service.

Donations. We receive some but not many and those are usually directed donations to the Hospitals.

The other half has to come from somewhere and that somewhere should be fundraisers or donations. Currently our

major fundraiser is the monthly Bingo game. Attendance has been going down at the game due to a number of reasons, the economy and other games in the area are part of that. Lack of help getting the word out is also part of it. We need more players and the only way to do that is to help spread the word. Flyers and posters and word of mouth. There is a core group of people that help every month with Bingo and I hope asking others to go out and put up posters/flyers and talk up the Bingo is not to much to ask. On the Saturday/Sunday before Bingo I try to put up flyers/posters in the Washington, Chittenden, Addison county areas. So far I have only run into ONE flyer in any area that was put up before I got there. We do have a direct mailing, an e-mail mailing, a facebook site and advertising.

We currently have a Shot Gun Raffle going. As of the date of this writing with one month to go (3-2-18) only 94 tickets out of 400 have been returned as sold to the chairman of that fundraiser.

I put to the Nobility a question. Do we get

other people's money to run the Center by Fundraising? Or by Dues increases? Or do we throw in the towel, and start looking to merge with another Shrine Center? I know many are now upset with that question but it is a real concern. We are reaching a point where we are in trouble and need to make some hard choices. Our Fraternity is a great one and it supports a great Philanthropy but like everything else in this world it needs money to run.

I urge everyone to think on this. Come to the meetings and voice your opinion. Help with the fundraisers.


I don't want YOUR money, I want your friend's and neighbor's money and that only happens with fundraisers that we all work on. If everybody does a little no one has to do a lot.

Introducing our New Vice President of Research Programs

Marc Lalande, Ph.D.

We are pleased to welcome our new vice president of research programs for Shriners Hospitals for Children, Marc Lalande, Ph.D. Dr. Lalande comes to us from the University of Connecticut, where he served as the HealthNet professor and chair, Department of Genetics and Genome Sciences, School of Medicine; director of the Stem Cell and Systems Genomics Institutes, and executive director of Genomics and Personalized Medicine programs. Previously, he was an associate professor of pediatrics at the Children's Hospital, Harvard Medical School in Boston. While in Boston, he began researching molecular genetics of pediatric neurodevelopmental disorders.

Dr. Lalande earned both his doctoral and master's degrees in medical biophysics from the University of Toronto in Canada, and his undergraduate degree at Laurentian University – Sudbury, also in Canada.

Real world experience

Dr. Lalande has been interested in nature since childhood – wondering what's in the sky and why animals behave as they do, and mulling over the infinite differences in people. This curiosity eventually led to the study of physics and biophysics. Interestingly, he never took an academic course in genetics – everything he learned was from a hands-on approach, especially in the laboratories. He has worked on separating chromosomes to learn more about genetic disorders, and his physics background made it possible for him to design an instrument that helped with this work.

"Understanding the genetics of a condition is the starting point — when you find one genetic answer, it is like a key that can lead to the discovery of new partner molecules, and then to a network of answers that can ultimately lead to new therapies," said Dr. Lalande. "Genetics is complicated. For example, the cystic fibrosis gene was discovered in the 1980s, and we are just now seeing the development of therapies."

Expanding research capabilities

As he begins to lead the research effort of Shriners Hospitals for Children, Dr. Lalande is "interested in enhancing the collaboration of the physicians and the scientists, and in advancing our research mission."

Dr. Lalande believes that while people are aware of the medical work of our health care system, they are much less cognizant of our contributions to medical knowledge via research.



"My goal is to raise our research profile and promote our efforts in a more Shriners Hospitals-centric manner," he said. He also hopes to encourage more multisite research efforts that involve several hospitals in a single endeavor. "What I hope to see is Shriners Hospitals labeled research with a national impact that combines the efforts of researchers and clinicians."

While Dr. Lalande is enjoying his new role at Shriners Hospitals' corporate headquarters in Tampa, Florida, he is experiencing a little bit of culture shock. "There is a big difference – especially in the temperatures and the traffic volume – between Tampa and Farmington, Connecticut," he said with a smile.

Dr. Lalande and his wife, Christine, have been married for 43 years and have two grown children, Frederick and Alexia, whom they hope to entice to join them in Florida someday, and two grandchildren.

We are pleased to have Dr. Lalande on our team and look forward to his impact on our research program, which funded 166 projects in 2017.

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston promotes self-confidence with reconstructive makeup clinic

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston is dedicated to the care of children and recognizes that reducing scar visibility is an important part of the healing process for burn survivors. That's why one of the many resources that Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston offers burn survivors is a makeup clinic.

Experienced makeup artist Robin Liebowitz, who is certified in reconstructive and corrective

makeup, works with the therapeutic services team to host a weekly clinic. Each week, Liebowitz teaches both male and female patients how to apply makeup that softens the appearance of scars.

The clinic provides all participants with a waterproof foundation that is carefully matched to each child's skin tone and is used to help patients achieve a natural appearance. The foundation stays on even when



kids go swimming or sweat while playing sports. Fresh makeup is provided whenever a patient runs out, and Liebowitz offers different pigment options for patients whose skin changes colors with the seasons. The clinic is a wonderful support service that helps promote self-confidence and is often the final touch patients need to heal.

One patient, Liebowitz recalls, came to the makeup clinic wearing a baseball hat and

a jacket he had buttoned all the way up. "He was so sad when he came into my room," Liebowitz says, "But, by the time he left, his jacket was unbuttoned and his hat was off and he had a huge smile on his face." The clinic is an important resource for kids with visible scars, and is a valuable non-surgical solution to scarring that helps patients become more self-assured and comfortable. "I

love to see the kids feeling more confident after having a makeup visit with me, and I know it's just a little something that makes this world an easier place for them to face."
