An Insider's Preview



TAMPA TAKES CENTER STAGE AS IMPERIAL SESSION DROPS ANCHOR

THE 152ND IMPERIAL SESSION of Shriners International is headed to Tampa, and nobody is more excited than local James Lich, Egypt Shriners Past Potentate and one of the key organizers for this year's event.

For James, who's been part of the fraternity for decades and has attended more than a dozen Imperial Sessions across North America, this year is special — not just because it's happening in his own city, but because of what Imperial Session means for Shriners everywhere.

"It's kind of like the Super Bowl, honestly. For Shriners, this is the one time a year we really get to celebrate both the fraternity and the philanthropy. It's our chance to bring everyone together, remember what matters, and just have a great time," James said.

James is quick to point out the perks of the location: "You're steps from the Riverwalk, the Florida Aquarium and Ybor City. The city's changed a lot in the last decade — the waterfront is booming, there's world-class dining, and neighborhoods are connected by new, modern transportation."

James, a longtime Tampa Bay resident, says the support from his temple is huge. "We're even organizing transportation between downtown and the Shrine Center, and hosting both formal and informal events."

Looking back on past Sessions, James says each city brings something unique — Daytona, Toronto, Charlotte, San Antonio — but he's learned a few universal lessons.

In 2026, Session will be held in a city known for its colorful history — including legends that it was founded by the pirate

"You always figure out what works and what doesn't. In Atlanta, we saw the importance of great hospitality and smooth logistics. In Tampa, we have an experienced events team, and the city itself is set up to make people feel welcome."

James' role this year is all about communication and creating a memorable experience: He'll be working closely on social media, the event website and the program book, making sure everyone is in the loop and that Imperial Session has that extra spark. "It's an honor to help put this hallmark event together. I want people to see not just Tampa's fun side, but also that the Shriners have been woven into this city's fabric for over a hundred years."

For James, Imperial Session is about more than ceremonies or legislation. "It's a celebration. It's about the fraternity, the philanthropy and — most importantly — the kids we serve. We get to reconnect, honor our patient ambassadors and remind ourselves why we wear the fez."

With the city ready and the Shriners eager to gather, James sums it up: "We're working on all cylinders to make this the best party we can. I hope everyone sticks around after Imperial Session and really experiences what Tampa Bay has to offer. There's a lot more here than you think."

Another great meeting this month in Boston. They are all eagerly awaiting the Joint Commission accreditation visit. This was anticipated earlier this month, but nothing yet. So much work goes into getting the Hospital and Staff ready. It is almost like waiting for Santa.

We currently have 5 patients being treated and many that come in for treatments same day, then return home to heal in the comforts of their home. It is so amazing to see that burn care has evolved that what once would have been hospital stays, now can be done in an outpatient setting.

I learned about how, currently in research, they are studying how to prevent surgical site infections before it has time to think about growing which can and could lead to another surgery. This also could cause more time in the hospital and replacement of hardware or much-needed grafting. Cutting-edge being studied and tested at Shriners'.

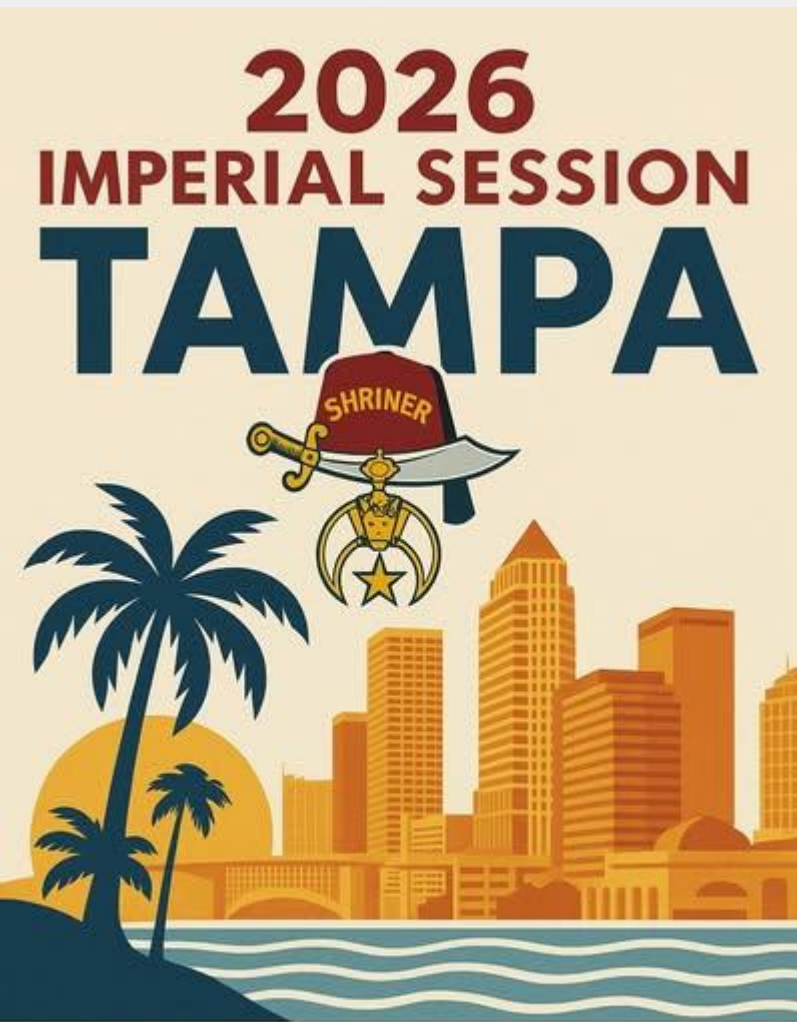
